SCORESBY STREET WORKS

Works continue to progress as scheduled on the Kerang CBD Redevelopment project as focus moves to the third section of the Victoria Street intersection. From Monday, August 16, 2021, works commenced on the corner of Scoresby and Victoria Street, near the Kerang Choice Cut butcher's shop.

As the next section of Scoresby Street is completed the roadway will remain open to motorists for use, with a 40-kilometre speed limit in place. All businesses along the Scoresby street corner will remain open during construction, with diversions in place for pedestrians.

Council thanks all motorists and pedestrians for their patience and anticipates that the Scoresby street works will be completed by the end of December 2021.



VIVID EXHIBITION

Hosted by the Gannawarra Library, Vivid Living's Culture and Art Group's mini village display will be on display at the Sir John Gorton Library Kerang from Monday, 30th of August to Saturday, the 18th of September.
